


Climate Change

The project will not only enable access to education, it will also help stimulate the economy and improve livelihoods.

COVID-19

In Papua New Guinea, Jack is supporting the national response to the COVID-19 pandemic. In his work as Health Cluster Coordinator with WHO, he has trained 60 health workers in vaccine administration, supported local NGOs assisting remote communities, and implemented health promotion training for health workers.
